

Bombay High Court stays probe into Dadasaheb Phalke award scam. Fraud Anil Mishra and son Abhishek allegedly organized fake award events, | deceiving celebrities and securing corporate sponsorships. Case investigation paused until November 2025 hearing.

Justice Shree Chandrashekhhar and Justice Gautam Ankhad issued this important stay. They served notice to complainant Sameer Dixit in the matter. The court scheduled next hearing for November 7, 2025. All investigation proceedings will remain paused until then.

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Mumbai Police Accept Fake Dadasaheb Phalke Awards

A shocking development, a notorious fraudster known for selling bogus DNA degrees has managed to distribute fake awards to Mumbai Police officers, despite having his claims to present these awarded bogus. The fraudster has even gained further attention after the Mumbai Police's official Twitter (Twitter) account shared screenshots of these fake awards, which had been issued as the fraudster received selling bogus DNA, according to an investigation by Sprouts' Social Investigation Team.

The fraudster, identified as Kalyan (G) Jain, was known for his involvement in a selling fake DNA. He has even registered a trademark for his award under the name of film icon Dadasaheb Phalke with the Copyright Commission of India to defraud the public. This individual has been selling these fake awards to police officers for a long time, including those with no connection to the film industry, such as his vendors.

The Indian government has established the Dadasaheb Phalke Award for the best performance of Phalke's memory, but the fraudster has been selling these fake awards for events two or three times a month, selling fake awards for as much as ₹2 lakhs.

He has even managed to hooking police officers in Mumbai, including Assistant Commissioners, Senior Police Inspectors, and Police Constables, to buy these fake awards. A tweet registered the incident.

In a further investigation, the Mumbai, Kalyan Jain is posted Mumbai Police's official account to post about the fake awards. A tweet registered the incident.

This is not the first time Kalyan Jain has been in the news. In 2019, he was previously held by valid police offices for money laundering.

He is a Mumbai distributor of the film of Dadasaheb Phalke. Although the Dadasaheb Phalke Award is given to individuals in the film industry, Kalyan Jain has made efforts to legitimize his fake awards by targeting political and public representatives, sharing their photos on social media to further their activities and demanding money from them.

Sprints' Special Investigation Team has gathered information that fraudster like Kalyan Jain are using these fake awards to scam lakhs of rupees.

He is also selling PhD degrees. In Maharashtra, he is selling lakhs of rupees.

Neelima Madani Nobel Award Academy

are reportedly accepting these fake awards in Dadasaheb Phalke's name. Some like Yegesh Laharia, the owner of 'Bright Outlook Media', have also accepted these even though multiple fake Phalke Sprints have been awarded to them.

These activities and usage Mumbai Police Commissioner Virek Parmasani to take immediate action.

Sprints' Award to Mumbai Police Commissioner

The selling of fake awards and bogus PhDs is a crime, and Sprints has requested immediate action against fraudster Kalyan Jain, including the deletion of the unverified links to the fake awards and a comprehensive investigation into these fraudulent activities.

Bandra police uncovered this alleged scam in February 2025. They accused Anil Mishra and his son Abhishek of cheating. The duo allegedly organized fake Dadasaheb Phalke International Film Festival events. They reportedly misrepresented these as government-backed award ceremonies.

The accused used sophisticated methods to gain credibility. They created fabricated letters featuring top government officials. These included fake documents with President and Prime Minister's signatures. Many Bollywood celebrities attended believing events were genuine.

Corporate Sponsorships and High-Value Ticket Sales

The alleged scam secured major corporate partnerships. Reputed companies like PVR Inox and Cinopolis sponsored events. Big FM and PNB Bank also provided financial support. Several state tourism departments supported these award functions.

Tickets sold for staggering amounts through BookMyShow. Some couples paid up to ₹2.5 lakh for attendance. The Sprouts News investigation reveals sophisticated operation. Accused continued despite trademark application rejection.

Legal Proceedings and Industry Impact

The FIR includes serious cheating and impersonation charges. Bandra police registered case number 192 of 2025. This follows complaint by BJP Film Union's Maharashtra president. The original DPIFF has filed a separate defamation suit.

They accuse certain persons of tarnishing their reputation. The organization emphasizes its credibility and goodwill. This case highlights vulnerabilities in film award
